**HC-MCH 430: Developing & Implementing Evidence-Based Clinical Practice**

**Objective:** To provide to professionals and volunteers in maternal child health care knowledge of evidence-based medical frameworks and the application of evidence to the clinical setting.

**Learning Outcome:** Upon successful completion of this course, the student will be able to describe the history and framework of evidence-based models for common hospital and breastfeeding practices; discuss specific practices related to breastfeeding and the evidence or lack of evidence to support these practices; define and differentiate hospital policies, procedures, standards of care, and protocols and give examples of each, assess, evaluate and describe problems and strengths of hospital policies, procedures and standards of care; analyze and discuss the Ten Steps to Successful Breastfeeding in hospital practice; and develop, discuss and evaluate negotiation strategies and quality processes for multidisciplinary teams in hospitals.
