Topics explored during this workshop will include human milk in the NICU, transitioning premies to breast, donor milk, fortified milk, the maternal cost of providing milk, and the importance of safe, sterile preparation of infant formula.

Dr Kathleen Marinelli is a Neonatologist at Connecticut Children's Hospital and an internationally recognized expert in the field of Human Lactation. She also serves as the Medical Director of the New England Milk Bank.

Briana Jegier, PhD, CLC

Dr. Briana Jegier is an assistant professor and research specialist in the College of Nursing. She spends countless hours between teaching and working on numerous research projects for the Mothers' Milk Club. Lactation Care Providers must be able to interpret non-verbal cues from many different sources. There are non-verbal cues in the baby's first hour of life and the nine instinctive stages, there are non-verbal feeding cues that the baby exhibits before, during and after a feed, and there are non-verbal cues that a mother displays during a counseling session. This workshop will help you to identify these cues as well as identify the cues you may be inadvertently giving to the mother!

Dr. Anna Blair has conducted research on sore nipples and positioning/latch.
